Organized in Paris at *Le Muséum* by the *Département de Préhistoire*, this module is part of the Master "*Evolution, Patrimoine naturel, Sociétés*", cursus "*Quaternaire et Préhistoire*".

This module is organized in the frame of both the HOPSEA (*Human Origins Patrimony in Southeast Asia*) project (Asia-Link Program) and the International Master course "*Quaternary and Prehistory*" (Erasmus Mundus Program). Its purpose is to promote, on a specific topic, scientific exchanges between teaching-staff, PhD students, and Master students from various countries, as well as present and future co-promotion of Master and PhD theses.

Validation of the module (3 ECTS) will be acknowledged by the members of the Erasmus Mundus consortium "*Quaternary and Prehistory*" and by the Johann-Wolfgang Goethe Universität (Frankfurt/Main). At this stage, the commonly-organized validation of the module is considered as a pioneer action towards mutual acknowledgment of credit between Asian and European universities, as encouraged by the European Commission.
